## Virginia Beach Library Foundation Jan Stauber Grant Program – final report

#### A Description of the completed project:

We successfully presented a murder mystery party for 36 teenagers at the MEO Central Library. The event, inspired by the renowned literary detective Sherlock Holmes, the mystery game, a Murder on Baker Street, provided participants with an immersive and interactive experience from 6:00 to 9:00 pm. Teen attendees selected parts (including Holmes, Watson, Lord Blackwood and Ada Adler), and those who came without costumes were able to enter a raffle for some costume pieces. All were given hardbound pocket notebooks and pens upon arrival, setting the stage for their participation in the Holmes mystery narrative. A book tasting of teen mystery novels was available in the common area for browsing. Participants were divided into two concurrent dinner groups, each tasked with solving the crime while in character and socializing. A pasta supper and dessert were served by costumed staff members, reinforcing the thematic ambiance of the event. A mocktails bar featuring Sherlock Holmesinspired punch drinks was available throughout the event, providing refreshments while participants immersed themselves in the mystery. Additionally, a photo booth was accessible for participants to capture memories of their experience. Attendees left with a copy of a Sherlock Holmes Triple Feature volume that contained the Sir Arthur Conan Doyle stories A Study in Scarlet, The Sign of Four, and The Hound of the Baskervilles as well as measuring bookmarks to use to increase their powers of observation, like Holmes.

### The goals that were achieved

The project successfully increased the participants' interest in reading, introduced them to Sherlock Holmes and helped them discover more about the mystery genre by providing them with an immersive experience centered around the beloved literary character, Sherlock Holmes. Attendees were given Sherlock Holmes books and encouraged to participate actively in solving a mystery that described and had them portray some of Doyle's characters, thereby fostering a deeper appreciation for the literature. The mystery plot itself was based around a common theme in the mystery genre: the house party. The mystery genre book tasting expanded interest beyond the Doyle texts to adjacent stories and young adult modern stories.

The event fostered a sense of community and belonging among our teen participants through the interactive storytelling and mystery-solving activities. By dividing participants into two concurrent groups, the project encouraged collaboration and communication among a manageable sized group of peers, enhancing social skills and fostering a sense of camaraderie in each dinner group.

#### The project's impact on the grantee, organization, and participants:

- The project enhanced the organization's reputation as a hub for community engagement and innovative programming, attracting a diverse audience of teenagers to the library.
- The success of the event garnered positive attention from teen and adult stakeholders, contributing to increased visibility and recognition for the grantee organization and for Sherlock Holmes and the novels of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle within our community.
