

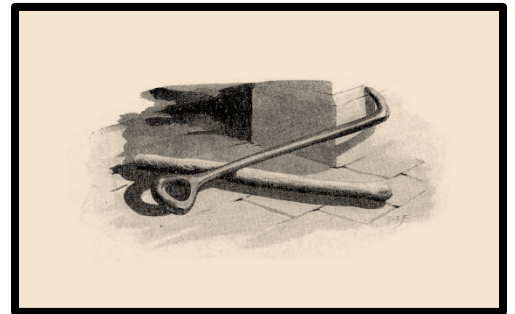


The Return of Sherlock Holmes
