

IN 1849, OF 20,000 SUSPICIOUS DEATHS IN ALL OF ENGLAND AND WALES, ONLY ELEVEN INVOLVED POSSIBLE MURDER BY POISON (AND NOT ALL WERE FOUND GUILTY).





PUBLIC FEAR, HOWEVER, FUELED AN INCREASE IN ARRESTS AND PROSECUTION, WITH THE NUMBER OF TRIALS RISING FROM SEVEN IN 1829-1838 TO 23 FROM 1839 TO 1848; TO 17, 1849-1858, BEFORE DROPPING TO SEVEN THE NEXT DECADE.





IN ADDITION TO BEING SOLD IN PHARMACIES AS A MEDICINE AS WELL AS TO ELIMINATE RATS, ANTS, AND OTHER VERMIN IT WAS A COMMON INGREDIENT IN MANY HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS, INCLUDING PAINT, DYE, AND EVEN SOAP.






VTIDOTE.—After an emetic, give sweet oil, butter or midrated Oxide of Iron.

IN 1836, THE HIGHLY SENSITIVE MARSH TEST, NAMED FOR ITS DISCOVERER, PROVIDED THE FIRST RELIABLE MEANS FOR IDENTIFYING THE PRESENCE OF ARSENIC, EVEN IN THE STOMACH CONTENTS OF CORPSES.

#### MARSH'S APPARATUS.


In Marsh's apparatus, fig. 15, A is the gas evolving bottle, provided with funnel tube a, and escape tube b. B is a chloride of calcium tube supported by stand C. Tube b is connected to c by india-rubber joint d. The gas issues at point of tube f, where it may be inflamed. (See pp. 80-90.)

A simple apparatus, consisting of a test tube provided with a cork and pointed tube may serve in many experiments.









WHILE ARSENIC COULD BE UNDETECTABLE TO ITS VICTIM, PRUSSIC ACID, OR CYANIDE, HAD A VERY DISTINCT ODOR.





NAMED FOR THE BLUE PIGMENT PRUSSIAN BLUE FROM WHICH IT WAS FIRST ISOLATED, THE ACID IS ALSO FOUND IN THE PITS OF VARIOUS FRUITS, INCLUDING BITTER ALMONDS.



#### LONDON SUICIDE INQUEST

A verdict that he took poison while the balance of his mind was disturbed was returned at an inquest on Wednesday on Edward Hyde, of London, who died on Sunday in Soho.

The veins in the neck and bases of the lungs were congested—the congestion being a sign of narcotic poisoning. A ottle found by the bedside smelt very ongly of a fluid, a mixture in which was a lot of poison. If the bottle ull, Hyde must have drank as much ounces.

EVEN PARLIAMENT'S ATTEMPT IN 1851 TO REGULATE ARSENIC SALES BY REQUIRING PHARMACISTS KEEP A LEDGER OF SALES AND ORDERING CERTAIN AMOUNTS OF ARSENIC BE COLORED WITH SOOT OR INDIGO TO PREVENT MURDER ATTEMPTS HAD LITTLE EFFECT BECAUSE SO FEW OF POISONINGS WERE HOMICIDES.

THAT NO POISONS WERE EVER IDENTIFIED BY NAME IN THE SHERLOCK HOLMES' STORIES (OTHER THAN PRUSSIC ACID INTENDED FOR SUICIDE) MOST LIKELY REFLECTS EVEN THE LIMITS OF YOUR ABILITY TO DETERMINE THE EXACT CAUSE OF DEATH.





AS IN <u>A STUDY IN SCARLET</u>, YOU MIGHT BE ABLE TO PROVE A HOMICIDE WITH THE DEATH OF A TERRIER, BUT BEYOND THAT, EVEN YOU COULDN'T NAME THE POISON.




